



Quick Facts: Lānaʻi

The smallest inhabited island measuring 141 square miles with just more than 3,500 residents, Lānaʻi has the feel of a private, exclusive enclave. Though it was once the site of Hawaiʻi’s largest pineapple plantation, now it’s home to one small hotel and two luxury resorts — one beachfront and the other upcountry amid highland forests. There are no traffic lights, but there are two world-class golf courses, and such amenities as a sporting clay facility, horseback riding, off-road jeep adventures, archery, executive putting course, spa, and ocean activities.
