


The smallest inhabited island measuring 141 square miles with just more than 3,500 residents, Lāna'i has the feel of a private, exclusive enclave. Though it was once the site of Hawai'i's largest pineapple plantation, now it's home to one small hotel and two luxury resorts one beachfront and the other upcountry amid highland forests. There are no traffic lights, but there are two world-class golf courses, and such amenities as a sporting clay facility, horseback riding, off-road jeep adventures, archery, executive putting course, spa, and ocean activities.
