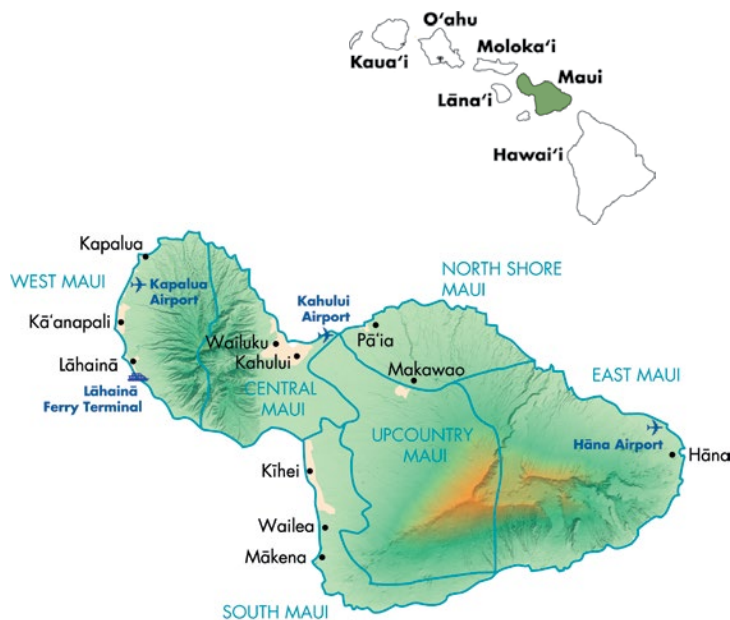




## Quick Facts: Maui
