ON YOUR LUNCHBREAK

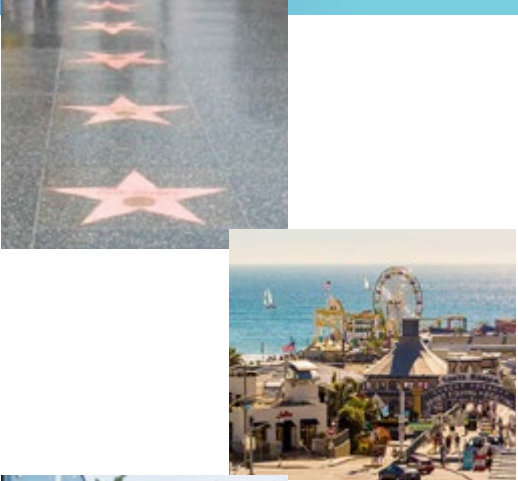
Take a hike... literally. [Griffith Park](#) is one of the largest urban parks in the U.S. and is easily accessible from many different neighborhoods. Don’t miss [Griffith Observatory](#), the most visited public observatory in the world!



Take a “flight.” The historic [Angel’s Flight](#) funicular is the world’s shortest railway, designed to take you up the steep incline of Bunker Hill in downtown. A quick ride pairs nicely with lunch at [Grand Central Market](#).

ON YOUR DAY OFF

See the Stars. It wouldn’t be a trip to Los Angeles without exploring the Hollywood Walk of Fame. If you’re lucky, you can even [catch a ceremony](#) (*open to the public*) when they add a new star. At nearby [Universal Studios Hollywood®](#), the outdoor dining and shopping at CityWalk® complements a behind-the-scenes tour of one of the world’s most famous movie studios.



A Day at the Beach. Santa Monica offers a walkable beach day experience with easy access from the airport or downtown. [Rent a bike](#) to ride down the beach, take a spin on one of the amusement rides on [The Pier](#), and people watch while you dine al fresco at the [3rd Street Promenade](#).

Culture Vulture. Downtown LA offers a vibrant art scene with everything from street art and art deco architecture to museums like [The Broad](#), the [MOCA](#) and the [GRAMMY Museum](#). Explore on your own, or if you prefer a guide, check out [LA Walking Tours](#). Top off your evening with the [LA Philharmonic](#) at The Walt Disney Concert Hall. (*Performances resume in 2021.*)
